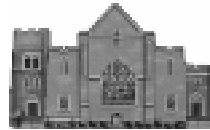




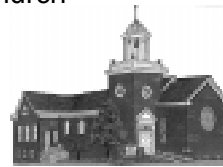
## Self-Guided Walking Tour

- #2 54 E. Maple St. — former Hoff home
- #3 17 E. Maple St. **OPEN** — former Wolf home
- #4 55 Front St. — former Wolf home
- #5 25 Front St. — Wolf home
- #6 1 S. Main St. **OPEN** — formerly Wolf Supply, The Lumber Yard, and a butcher shop; presently Otterbein's Carpenter Center
- #7 44 N. Main St. — home of Ed Houston/broommaker
- #8 56 N. Main St. — formerly Charlie Mohr's Bowling Alley & Restaurant
- #9 152 N. Main St. — formerly Pennsylvania Wire Cloth Company, American Wire Fabrics; now New York Wire Co (division of Root Corp.)
- #10 309 N. Main St. — Kauffman-Toomey homestead
- #11 117 N. Main St. — one of the oldest homes in the town, built circa 1880; property also site of Mount Wolf Shirt Company and a tin shop
- #12 97 N. Main St. —formerly Mt. Wolf Baking Company, a tin shop, then Blymire's Barber Shop
- #13 55 N. Main St. — home of Jesse and Annie Rodes, founders of Otterbein (formerly EUB) Church
- #14 22 S. Main St. **OPEN** — formerly Hussie Bare's Tavern; now Otterbein Church's Gap
- #15 36 S. Main St. — formerly Shank's Barber Shop and Zellers Barber Shop
- #16 46 S. Main St. — formerly Austin Smith's Restaurant
- #17 88 Maple St. — was Treva McCarney Beauty Shop
- #18 120 S. Main St. — Brenner's Store and Restaurant
- #19 25 Walnut St. **OPEN** — formerly Superior Paper Products and St. Regis; now Georgia-Pacific
- #20 219 Walnut St. — former schoolhouse, residence of Minnie Sweitzer and then Ruth Lehr
- #21 195 S. Main St. **OPEN** — the location of V.F.W. Post 2493 / former Hoff home

- #24 55 S. Main St. — site of K.G.E. Hall (at one time hosted community & church groups, fire company, and grocery stores: C.N. Kretchman's, Seitz's and Jordan's)
- #25 131 Center St. **OPEN** — Otterbein United Methodist Church, Northeastern Senior Center (Closed)
- #26 6 N. 2nd St. — was Bill Bowers' Garage

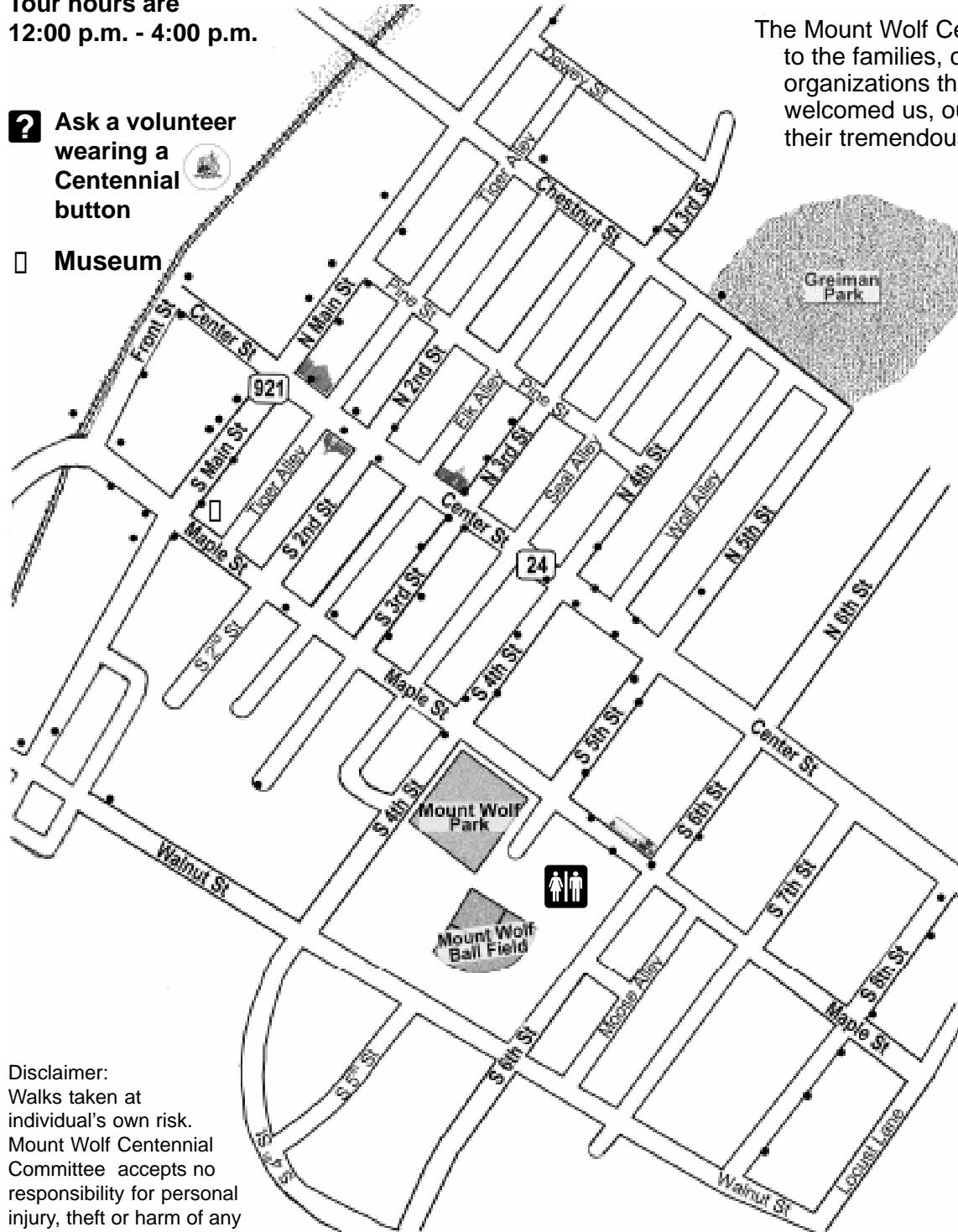
