First Fire Truck in Conewago Township



The Strinestown Community Fire Company was organized in 1953 and took delivery of this GMC/Darley pumper in November, 1954. Having a pump capacity of 500 gallons per minute and holding 800 gallons of water, this truck served our rural township well. In 1974 this engine was relocated from the Strinestown station to a newly established satellite station located in the Conewago Township Building. After being replaced by a new engine it was retired and refurbished. Today, it currently represents the Fire Company at parades and funerals.

In 2005 a three bay station was built at 5 Fisher Drive, adjacent to the Conewago Township Building, and now houses an engine and a brush unit. An engine, rescue, tanker and a utility are located at the station built in 1980 on the Susquehanna Trail in Strinestown.
