MOUNT WOLF Henry J. Mohr, Sr., 88, died Sunday, July 24, 2011 at Pleasant Acres Nursing Home. He was the loving husband of Dorothy P. (Sprenkle) Mohr, to whom he was married 69 years. Born August 9, 1922, in Saginaw, he was the son of the late Charles C. and Nettie (Cunningham) Mohr.
